





Nelson Okanya, DIS, of Lancaster, Pennsylvania, is President of World Serving Leaders, the nonprofit division of the Center for Serving Leadership in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He is also Chair of the Global Mission Fellowship, a 74-member global network facilitated by Mennonite World Conference. Previously, he served as a pastor and as President of Eastern Mennonite Missions. A trained executive and leadership coach, Dr. Okanya holds a Master of Divinity from Eastern Mennonite Seminary in Harrisonburg, Virginia, and a Doctorate in Intercultural Studies from Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, California.
